

# Snowflake Table Runner

## Yardage Needed (*Cut WOF\**)

Fabric 1 – Center Block (1) and binding	2/3 yard
Fabric 2 – Outer Blocks (2)	1/2 yard
Fabric 3 – White -- Snowflakes & Border	1 yard

*\*width of fabric*

## Cutting Instructions

### Block 1 – Center Block

*Cut the largest pieces first. Use the leftover piece to cut smallest pieces. All measurements are in inches.*

Fabric 1 – Cut (6) 1.5-inch wide strips from WOF  
Sub cut the following pieces from these strips:

(4)	8.5 x 1.5
(4)	6.5 x 1.5
(12)	4.5 x 1.5
(12)	3.5 x 1.5
(8)	2.5 x 1.5
(25)	1.5 x 1.5

Fabric 3 – Cut (3) 1.5-inch wide strips from WOF  
Sub cut the following pieces from these strips:

(2)	8.5 x 1.5
(2)	7.5 x 1.5
(4)	4.5 x 1.5
(16)	2.5 x 1.5
(20)	1.5 x 1.5

### Block 2 – Outer Blocks (*Cutting instructions will yield pieces to make 2 blocks*)

Fabric 2 – Cut (10) 1.5-inch wide strips from WOF  
Sub cut the following pieces from these strips:

(8)	8.5 x 1.5
(8)	6.5 x 1.5
(40)	3.5 x 1.5
(24)	2.5 x 1.5
(50)	1.5 x 1.5



Finished Size\*: 19" x 59"

*\*instructions for adjusting final length to suit your table included*

Fabric 3 – Cut (6) 1.5-inch wide strips from WOF

Sub cut the following pieces from these strips:

- (4) 8.5 x 1.5
- (4) 7.5 x 1.5
- (8) 4.5 x 1.5
- (32) 2.5 x 1.5
- (40) 1.5 x 1.5

## Sashing and Borders

Cut (5) 2.5-inch strips from WOF.

Sub cut into (4) 15.5 x 2.5 pieces; use these pieces for short sashing.

Use remaining strips to create long sashing. Sew these strips end-to-end; then cut (2) long strips measuring 59.5 x 2.5 inches.

TO MAKE THE RUNNER LONGER: You can customize your final length by adding extra white rectangles to each end. For example, I needed an extra 3 inches on each end to fit my table. I cut (1) 3.5-inch strip from WOF, then sub cut it into (2) 19.5 x 3.5-inch pieces. These were sewn on to the short ends of my runner to bring the total length to 65 inches.

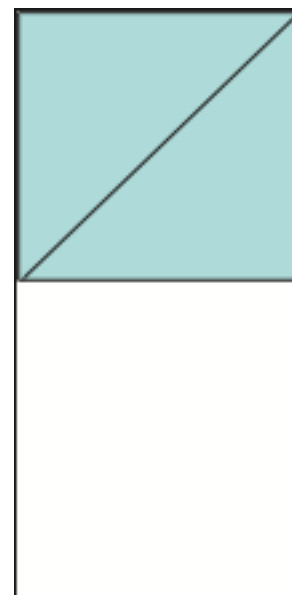
## Piecing Instructions

Refer to the Block Diagrams for placement of pieces.

- The numbers on the images refer to the finished length of each piece.
- The numbers with the W in front refer to the snowflake fabric (in my case that fabric was white.)
- Sew seams carefully and measure your sections after each piece is added for correct sizing. This block is good practice for perfect piecing. Go slow and be accurate for best results.
- Press to the darker fabric as much as possible. Press after each piece is added as well. (A good habit to get into—and well worth it to prevent shadow-through.)
- Refer to graphic and instructions below for the pieces with a pointed end.

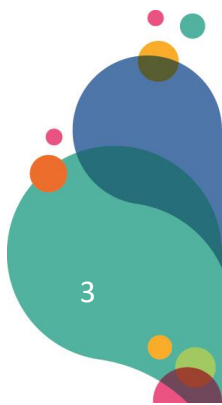
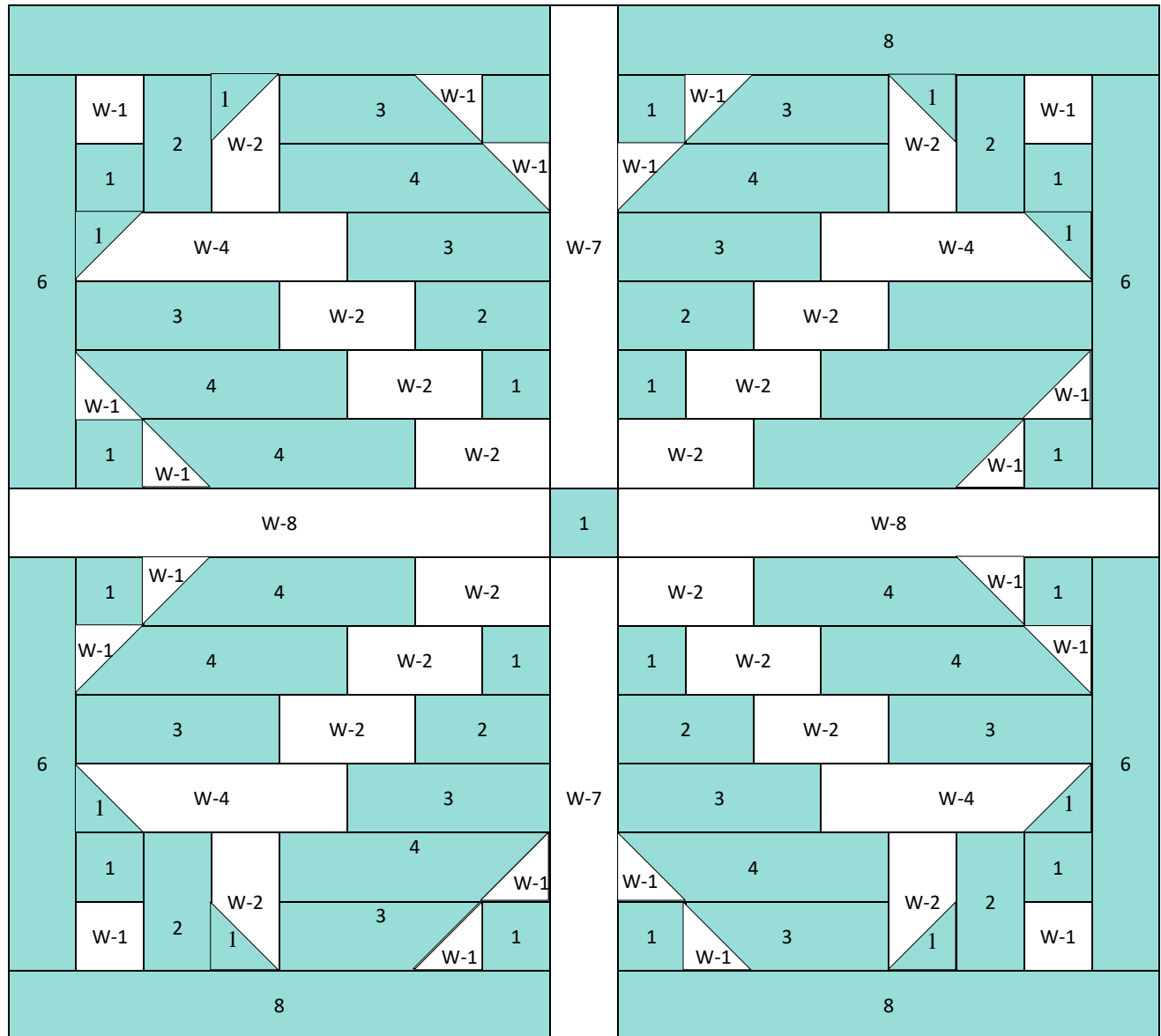
### Pointed End Piece instructions:

Place correct size and color rectangle and correct color 1.5-inch square right sides together. Draw a line with mechanical pencil from corner to corner, referring to the main graphic for correct angle. Sew on the line and trim away excess.
